From the North:

Take Interstate 295 south to the Atlantic City Expressway for about 0.5 mi., bear right to Rt. 55 towards Glassboro. Take Rt. 55 south to Exit 50A (Rt. 322 east). Follow Rt. 322 to Rt. 47. At 47 make a right onto Rt. 47 South (Delsea Drive). On Rt. 47 travel approximately 2.5 mi., Gloucester County Office Complex is on the right. The Office of Government Services Bldg. A is the first building on your left.

From the East:

Take Harding Highway/Rt. 40 west, becomes Rt. 47 North (Delsea Drive). On Rt. 47 travel approximately 2.5 mi. The Office of Government Services Bldg. A is on your left.

From the Southeast:

Rt. 55, Exit 43– toward Franklinville/ Clayton. Turn right onto Little Mill Rd. Turn left onto Rt.47 (Delsea Drive). On Rt. 47 travel approximately 2.5 mi. The Office of Government Services Bldg. A is the first building on your left.
