





Public hearing via conference call, was taken before Jean B. Delaney, Certified Shorthand Reporter and Notary Public of the State of New Jersey, on the above date, commencing at 3:05 p.m.

1 MS. CERNY: Good afternoon. My name
2 is Lisa Cerny and I am the Director of the Division
3 of Human and Disability Services within Gloucester
4 County's Department of Health and Human Services. I
5 oversee Paratransit Services, and at today's public
6 hearing we are here to discuss the 2021 Casino Tax
7 Revenue funding received from New Jersey Transit.
8 Today's public hearing is sponsored by our local
9 transportation advisory committee and the Gloucester
10 County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

11 I am pleased to hear that Dennis
12 Ledger, Chairman of the Local Citizen's
13 Transportation Advisory Committee, is on the line.

14 Thank you, Dennis.

15 MR. LEDGER: You're welcome, Lisa.
16 Thank you.

17 MS. CERNY: We also have other members
18 from our Transportation Advisory Board Committee
19 which I will recognize at the end.

20 The purpose of this hearing is to
21 learn more about the delivery of Paratransit
22 Services In Gloucester County and obtaining input
23 from our residents to improve transportation
24 services. Today's hearing will focus on the receipt
25 of fiscal year 2021 Casino Tax Revenues that have

1 been made available under the Senior Citizen and
2 Disabled Resident Transportation Assistance Program.
3 That acronym is known as SCDRTAP or "SCDRTAP". This
4 legislation was established in 1984 to use Casino
5 Tax Revenues to offer new and expanded
6 transportation services to the elderly and disabled
7 residents of New Jersey. Today we will accept
8 comments regarding Gloucester County's application
9 for the FY2021 SCDRTAP funds under the Casino
10 legislation.

11 The total amount of the SCDRTAP funds
12 for 2021 is \$583,833. Gloucester County's fiscal
13 year 2021 Casino application addresses the need for
14 Paratransit Services to continue to coordinate
15 services to enhance mobility for our residents. Our
16 overall budget focuses on operations. Operational
17 funds represent about three quarters of our budget.
18 Operational funds are used to support our drivers,
19 schedulers, and vehicle operating needs.

20 Casino funding plays an important part
21 of our whole transportation service and it covers
22 over a third of the current scheduled trips
23 provided. Medical issues such as dialysis
24 treatment, cancer treatment, physical therapy, and
25 routine medical appointments continue to be needed

1 throughout our community. Gloucester County will
2 seek opportunities to coordinate services in 2021 to
3 expand dialysis and cancer-related transportation
4 and expand employment transportation opportunities.

5 In 2019, DTS provided total trips of
6 42,185, which is about 175 trips per day, funded as
7 follows:

8 4,512 rides funded under the County
9 Division of Senior Services, Title 3.

10 2,992 rides funded under FTA Section
11 5311.

12 840 rides funded under the Department
13 of Military and Veteran Affairs.

14 3,851 rides funded under New Jersey
15 State Title 20.

16 3,935 rides funded under FTA Job
17 Access and Reverse Community Grant, the JARC grant
18 which is a work and educational-related grant.

19 5,928 rides funded under FTA section
20 5310.

21 The remaining 20,127 trips were funded
22 under this Casino grant.

23 Administratively, Casino funds will
24 help support two salaries within the department.

25 Administrative staff is responsible for the

1 submission of grants and other necessary paperwork
2 to keep the transportation program running. The
3 administrative staff is also responsible for the
4 reporting requirements mandated by each funding
5 source.

6 The Board of Chosen Freeholders
7 approved \$644,852, or 37 percent of the budget in
8 2019 to expand transportation services for senior
9 citizens and persons with disabilities. Funding
10 provided by the Board supports all of the
11 transportation services provided by DTS.

12 Our three primary goals for 2021 are
13 associated with pursuing recommendations contained
14 within the coordinated human services transportation
15 plan. The three major goals for 2021 are:

16 Continue our working relationship
17 with Ecolane Customer Support for the routing and
18 scheduling software system DTS acquired in 2015.
19 The routing and scheduling software includes GPS,
20 AVL, and tablet computers in each vehicle.

21 Ride sharing, continue to reduce per
22 trip costs by focusing and capitalizing on
23 ridesharing opportunities to improve efficiency.

24 The new software system is allowing us
25 to look at routing and scheduling improvements with

1 ridesharing opportunities and has decreased our
2 dependence on outside vendors.

3 Continue our partnership collaborative
4 with Pascale Sykes, New Jersey Transit, and other
5 working partners including the United Way of
6 Gloucester County, Cross County Connections, Heart
7 of Gloucester County, and South Jersey Transit
8 Authority.

9 Since the Pureland Shuttle began
10 taking passengers on June 1st of 2015, over 205,000
11 trips, which equals about 200 passengers a day, have
12 been provided from Avandale Park and Ride to the
13 Pureland Industrial Park, which is the largest
14 industrial park on the east coast. There are ten
15 stops in between, giving residents the opportunity
16 to connect with thirteen New Jersey Transit routes.
17 There is no east/west public transportation system
18 in Gloucester County. This route gives us
19 transportation on either side of the Pureland
20 Industrial Park. With the continued support of the
21 Board of Chosen Freeholders, along with our success
22 in coordination services and our continued efforts
23 to secure additional revenues, we will work hard to
24 continue to provide transportation needed to our
25 most vulnerable residents.

1 with today's public hearing we are
2 offering the opportunity for our residents to
3 provide additional insight into the provision of
4 transportation services to our senior citizens and
5 people with disabilities. Therefore, if anyone has
6 comments regarding our Paratransit Services or how
7 human services transportation can be improved in any
8 way, we would appreciate hearing your comments
9 today.

10 This public hearing was advertised in
11 the South Jersey Media and the Courier Post
12 newspapers. A copy of our FY2021 application will
13 be available at our transportation home office at
14 115 Budd Boulevard, West Deptford, in the Mullica
15 Hill County Library, and on the county website for
16 public review.

17 Once again, the purpose of the public
18 hearing is to provide insight and to gather
19 information about the transportation needs of our
20 residents so that services can be improved and be
21 made more responsive to our residents. We would
22 like to thank the Board of Chosen Freeholders, our
23 Advisory Committee members, and New Jersey Transit
24 staff for their continued support.

25 As I have mentioned, today in

1 attendance we have members of our Advisory Committee
2 on the call which includes Dennis Cook, Bob Dazlich,
3 Sal Barbuto, Theresa Ziegler, and I think Lisa
4 Tulley may still be on the line with New Jersey
5 Transit.

6 The Advisory Committee members do a
7 great job dedicating and volunteering their time to
8 make transportation better for the residents of
9 Gloucester County and should be applauded for that.
10 We thank you for your dedication to be the voice for
11 Gloucester County residents in need of
12 transportation.

13 I also want to thank the Gloucester
14 County Board of Chosen Freeholders, in particular
15 Freeholder Director Robert Damminger, Deputy
16 Director Frank DeMarco, and our Freeholder Liaison,
17 Jim Jefferson, and county administration for their
18 commitment to providing quality transportation
19 services to the residents of the county. There are
20 many people involved in supporting our efforts to
21 continue to provide the exemplary services you have
22 come to expect.

23 I also want to thank all of our
24 wonderful passengers over the years in making our
25 transportation program a success.

1 If anyone wishes to testify or provide
2 comments this afternoon, I ask that you state your
3 name, spelling, if necessary, and the town in which
4 you reside. I will withhold any response to
5 questions until the end so that everyone has a
6 chance to speak. I will write them down, but I will
7 respond to questions at the end when everyone is
8 finished their testimony.

9 Once again, thank you for joining us
10 today.

11 So I will open up the call lines for
12 comments at this time.

13 HELEN ABBOTT: Hello. My name is
14 Helen Abbott, and I've been riding with Gloucester
15 County Transportation since 1976, and they are very
16 good, and on time, and very courteous and helpful
17 when they come to pick us up for our rides. I take
18 it to VISCOP, I take it to Shades, and I take it to
19 support services at Shady Lane Nursing Home, and
20 they've always been very good, very polite and very
21 helpful. I will say every one of the workers are
22 great from the ones on the telephone as well as the
23 ones that drive us to where we have to go. I also
24 ride AccessLink. They do good, too, getting us
25 where we have to go. We have a couple of problems

1 sometimes, but not many. And I live at 1351 Good
2 Intent Road, Woodbury, New Jersey 09086. Thank
3 you. I've been riding since 1996.

4 MS. CERNY: Thank you, Helen.

5 DONALD FREEBERG: My name is Donald
6 Freeberg. I live in Deptford Township, and I would
7 like to know what the policy is on sterilizing the
8 busses when we get on to ride.

9 MS. CERNY: Okay. Thank you.

10 THERESA VAN METER: My name is Theresa
11 Van Meter. I'm from Clayton.

12 I just want to say Gloucester County
13 is great and AccessLink is also good, but I have
14 problems with Logisticare for medical.

15 MS. CERNY: Okay. Theresa, I will get
16 that information from Kim, and we will see what we
17 can do, okay?

18 THERESA VAN METER: Thank you. Thank
19 you.

20 ROBERT MOSHINSKY: My name is Bob
21 Moshinsky. I am -- I'm living in Sewell, New
22 Jersey, and I've been taking the transportation for
23 a number of years now. My question is this:
24 Gloucester County used to -- I'm a Veteran, and
25 Gloucester County used to provide us with

1 transportation directly to the V.A. Hospital in
2 Philadelphia. They stopped doing that, and now
3 we -- we still can get to the V.A. Hospital but we
4 have to go through SEN-HAN in Camden County. My
5 question is this. Are there any plans to start up
6 the direct trips to the V.A. Hospital in -- in
7 Philadelphia in the near future? We have to go to
8 SEN-HAN, which is a Senior Handicapped -- it's
9 equivalent to the Gloucester County Transportation,
10 only for Camden County. So we have to go to Camden
11 County and transfer from there, and they are having
12 transportation five days a week to the V.A. Hospital
13 in Philadelphia. Once again, my question is, is
14 Gloucester County, do they have any plans to -- to
15 reinstitute the direct -- it used to be that
16 Gloucester County and Camden County used to -- used
17 to share, doing them Monday and Wednesday for one
18 county and Tuesday and Thursday for another county,
19 but that was eliminated some time ago. And I'm
20 wondering if there is any plans to reinstitute that
21 transportation medium.

22 MS. CERNY: Thank you Bob. I will
23 address it at the end.

24 ROBERT MOSHINSKY: Okay.

25 MS. CERNY: Any other comments?

1 DONALD FREEBERG: Yes. Donald
2 Freeberg again.

3 When do you have to stop using the
4 term Board of Chosen Freeholders?

5 MS. CERNY: Okay. All right.

6 THERESA ZEIGLER: Hi. This is Theresa
7 Zeigler. I speak on behalf of Gloucester County
8 Planning Division. We have one of our workers here,
9 Chrissy Frank, who has been utilizing the service
10 for many years, and I would like to say that she is
11 always picked up on time, dropped off on time. We
12 have not had a problem for all the years that she
13 has been here, and I believe it's over 20 years or
14 23 years. And I just have to say thank you for the
15 services that you provide to get her to work because
16 without the service I do not think that her parents
17 could make the trip the couple times a week that she
18 utilizes it. So, thank you.

19 MS. CERNY: Thank you, Theresa.

20 Anything else? Okay. We've have more
21 questions this time than we've ever had before so
22 this is great.

23 Mr. Freeberg, you asked about the
24 sterilizing process. So the busses get sanitized on
25 a weekly basis, massive, you know, disinfectant on a

1 weekly basis. But each driver, every time,
2 disinfects the vehicles. And in between dropping
3 off passengers, they should be wiping down the
4 seats, which is how we want them for social
5 distancing.

6 And then your other question is, when
7 will we stop using the term Freeholders. That will
8 be phased out and effective January 1 of 2021. It
9 will be the County Commissioners.

10 DONALD FREEBERG: Very good.

11 MS. CERNY: Bob asked about the
12 Veteran's and whether or not we will go back to
13 providing and doing a shared services with SEN-HAN,
14 and unfortunately we are not. That's not in our
15 plans at the moment. We have an agreement with
16 SEN-HAN to provide the services on the days that we
17 used to do them over into Philly, so at this point
18 we are not.

19 Is there an issue with SEN-HAN that we
20 are not aware of?

21 ROBERT MOSHINSKY: There is not a
22 specific issue except that it was -- it was a real
23 convenience for us in Gloucester County because for
24 two days a week, I happen to be blind, and
25 particularly the people visually impaired have the

1 same problem, I'm sure, that when we have to
2 transfer from Gloucester County to SEN-HAN, that is
3 fine, they do the best, certainly, that they can.
4 But we did not have to -- we did not have to
5 transfer, and it made it very, very much easier for
6 us to -- to -- to accommodate ourselves for those
7 two days.

8 MS. CERNY: That's good information to
9 know, sir, and we will certainly take that under
10 consideration.

11 ROBERT MOSHINSKY: Thank you very
12 much.

13 LISA TULLEY: Lisa Tulley, and I just
14 wanted to say on behalf of New Jersey Transit, we
15 appreciate all the work that all of your staff has
16 done from you, to your administrative staff, to the
17 drivers. Thank you for taking care of everybody,
18 providing such wonderful service during this
19 pandemic, and doing everything that you've been able
20 to do to serve your residents. We thank you.

21 MS. CERNY: I knew you were on the
22 call, Lisa.

23 BARBARA LAZARO: This is Barbara
24 Lazaro, New Jersey Transit, and I wanted to echo
25 Lisa's sentiments. And it is so nice to hear that

1 everyone is being served so well by the folks in
2 Gloucester County, and it's great to hear that you
3 are doing such a great job for the people and the
4 residents. Thank you.

5 MS. CERNY: Any other comments for the
6 good of the order?

7 DONALD FREEBERG: Donald Freeberg. I
8 like the virtual meetings better than being in a
9 group in this particular pandemic.

10 MS. CERNY: This may be what we do
11 moving forward. We are not quite sure. This was
12 our first attempt at having a public hearing via
13 conference call, and we certainly had a lot more
14 participants than actually would attend our public
15 hearing in person and a lot more feedback and
16 interaction. So, you know, I will certainly meet
17 with the administration, and this may be the way we
18 go about doing things. But you will just have to
19 have your virtual cookies. I made sure you had
20 cookies this time Helen and Theresa, but since we
21 are not in person, you miss out on the cookies.

22 HELEN ABBOTT: We would rather be safe
23 anyway. We want to give our compliments to the work
24 that Gloucester County does for us.

25 MS. CERNY: Any other comments,

1 concerns, suggestions?

2 THERESA VAN METER: Thank you for
3 having the meeting. We weren't left out.

4 MS. CERNY: We would never leave you
5 out.

6 So has anybody joined the call during
7 my public hearing statement that wanted to be
8 recognized for the record that they were here? I
9 have a whole bunch of you who were talking in the
10 beginning. I know who was here. I have Dennis
11 Cook. I have Dennis Ledger. I had Bill from the
12 ARC. I have Frank DeMarco, Bob Dazlich, Sal, Lisa
13 Tulley, Maureen McClain, Theresa Van Meter, Helen
14 Abbott, Robert Moshinsky, Don Freeberg, Kim Wright,
15 Amy, Theresa Zeigler. Did I miss somebody?

16 DENNIS LEDGER: Ed Godfrey, this is
17 Dennis Ledger. How are you doing buddy? Did you
18 have any testimony that you wanted to provide?

19 ED GODFREY: No. I don't use the
20 service a lot. I have used it. I am very well
21 satisfied. I'm picked up and dropped off on time.
22 what I would like to find out, though, what is
23 the -- as you know, I moved into Paulsboro and I'm
24 not in Woodbury Heights no more. I would like to
25 use the service to go grocery shopping or something

1 like that. How is that done?

2 MS. CERNY: We have a Paulsboro
3 shuttle bus, but we will send you all of that
4 information. You are in our system; am I correct?

5 ED GODFREY: I should be, yes. I was
6 living in Woodbury Heights but two years ago I moved
7 into Paulsboro.

8 MS. CERNY: We have a shopping
9 schedule so we will make sure you get a copy of it;
10 okay?

11 ED GODFREY: Great. Thank you.
12 Fantastic. Thank you.

13 MS. CERNY: Hearing no other comments,
14 I will close the public hearing. I thank you
15 everyone for taking time out of your busy schedules
16 to participate in today's public hearing, and we do
17 have a stenographer on the call, and she is taking,
18 you know, our testimony and will -- it will be part
19 of our application and will be sent also to the
20 Freeholder Liaison and Gloucester County
21 Administration.

22 Thank you very much for participating.
23 Hopefully I will see everyone soon. In the
24 meantime, stay well, stay safe, and thank you.

This communication will serve as requisite opinion of counsel to be filed with NJ TRANSIT in connection with the application of the County of Gloucester for financial assistance pursuant to the provision of Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act, as amended for administration, capital and operating assistance projects. The legal authority for County of Gloucester's ability to carry out administration, capital and/or operating assistance projects directly, by lease, contract or otherwise as set forth below:

1. County of Gloucester is authorized to provide and assist public transportation by acquisition, construction and operation of existing or additional transit facilities. This assistance may be provided directly by the Gloucester County Division of Transportation Services, under the Department of Human & Disability Services, or by agreements with other parties.
2. The authority of the County of Gloucester to provide funds for the local share of the project is set forth by Resolution adopted by the County Board of Chosen Freeholders, and under N.J.S.A. 40:9-C-1 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 23-5.3.
3. I have reviewed the pertinent Federal, State, and local laws, and I am of the opinion that there is no legal impediment to making application for Section 5311 assistance. Furthermore, as a result of my examination, I am not aware of any pending or threatened litigation or other action which might in any way adversely affect the proposed project in the program or the ability of County of Gloucester to carry out such projects in the program.

- (6) Availability of information and reservation capability; and
- (7) Constraints on capacity or service availability.

In accordance with 49 CFR 37.77, public entities operating demand responsive/ Route Deviation systems for the general public which receive financial assistance under 49 U.S.C. 5311 or 5307 must file this certification with the appropriate state program office before procuring any inaccessible vehicle. Such public entities not receiving FTA funds shall also file the certification with the appropriate state program office. Such public entities receiving FTA funds under any other section of the FT Act must file the certification with the appropriate FTA regional office. This certification is valid for no longer than one year from its date of filing.




