**Keeping your summer safe:
 Protect yourself from mosquitos**

Gloucester County uses an Integrated Mosquito Management program to control the mosquito population. The program includes surveillance, larvacide, adulticide, and public awareness to help reduce mosquito breeding grounds.

Freeholder Deputy Director Frank J. DiMarco said, "Mosquitos can carry Zika, West Nile, Eastern Equine Encephalitis and other viruses."

Freeholder Heather Simmons, Liaison to the Department of Public Works, said this year the county is adding 60,000 Fathead Minnows (Pimephales promelas) in retention basins, woodland pools and other fresh water locations throughout the county.

"The fish are an effective and green method of reducing the mosquito population," Simmons said.

Mosquito Control can be reached Monday through Friday, 8 am to 4 pm at (856) 307-6400. Residents can also contact the Gloucester County Health Department with any concerns and/or complaints, Monday through Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm at (856) 218-4170.
