The classes are taught by leaders in the horticultural industry and land grant university faculty and staff.

**January 14, 2026: Plant Propagation** Learn the various methods of propagating plants, including cuttings and grafting.



**January 21, 2026: Bugs, Bugs Bugs!** An overview of insects and related arthropods. Learn to identify structural pests and management strategies to control them.



**January 28, 2026: Caring For Your Lawn** All aspects of lawn care will be discussed including selection of grasses, pests and diseases, and control methods.

**February 4, 2026: Pesticides– Use & Safety** Commonly used pesticides, their modes of actions and formulations will be discussed, and participants will learn how to read a pesticide label.



**February 11, 2026: Integrated Pest Management** Learn the definition and philosophy of IPM and how it is practiced.



**February 18, 2026: Houseplants** Bring the garden inside. Learn how to choose and care for the perfect plant for inside your home.



**February 25, 2026: Insects & Mites of Ornamentals** Common insect & mite pests of landscape trees & shrubs, and methods of identifying and controlling them will be discussed.

**March 4, 2026: What's Bugging My House?** Common insects that infest households, their lifecycles and integrated control strategies will be covered.



**March 11, 2026: Weeds, Weeds, Weeds!** Participants will learn to identify and control common weeds, and get some tips from the experts on how to diagnose the most common problems in the home landscape.



**March 18, 2026: Soils and Composting**

An overview of soil including soil types, nutrients, pH, topography. Discussion will also take place on the basics of composting and how to improve soil for better plant growth.

**March 25, 2026: It's a Jungle Out There, LIFE & DEATH in the Wildlife Garden** Be prepared for an eye-opening view into the natural world, occurrences that happen every day out in the wild but are rarely seen, unless you've created a wildlife garden so welcoming that wildlife feels quite at home!



**April 1, 2026: What's wrong with My Plant?** An overview of how plants function and various infectious and non-infectious causes of plant disease.

**April 15, 2026 Bees & Pollinators–** Learn the life cycles and behaviors of these important insects.

**April 22, 2026 Growing Annuals and Perennials:** Annual and perennial plants will be discussed along with their ornamental qualities, basic cultural requirements and common pests and diseases.

**April 29, 2026: Home Vegetable Gardening** In this class, you will learn the principles of successful vegetable and herb gardening.

**May 6, 2026: Landscape Designs**

**Landscape design primer:** Everything you need to know about designing with the right plants in the right places for the right reasons.

**Artsy Stuff in the Garden:** From watering cans through containers to stained glass, crafts, stone, metal, and truck tires with supplies from the basement to the attic this presentation will excite you with the possibilities waiting to happen for your next season out in the back forty!

**May 13, 2026: Native Plants** Discussion on the benefits of using native plants in the landscape followed by a presentation on native plant materials.



**May 20, 2026: Growing Fruit in the Home Garden** Learn how to successfully produce fruit from your own garden. Insects and diseases of fruit will also be discussed.



**May 27, 2026: Pruning:** This class location is TBA. Proper pruning techniques will be discussed and demonstrated along with the reasons for pruning and proper timing. This class will include hands-on pruning of trees and shrubs. Bring your favorite pruners!
