WHEREAS, the Gloucester County Department of Health and Human Services, through the Division of Transportation Services seeks to apply for available grant funds through the 2022 Senior Citizens and Disabled Residents Transportation Assistance Program ("SCDRTAP") Grant to provide non-emergency medical transportation for senior citizens and disabled residents and through the FTA Small Urban and Rural Public Transportation Grant (Section 5311) to provide transportation for eligible residents, from January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the SCDRTAP formula for the funding allocation to the County has been determined to be \$576,221.00 and as per the grant requirements, the County Local Citizen's Transportation Advisory Committee held a Public Hearing via teleconferencing on June 10, 2021 for the SCDRTAP allocation;

WHEREAS, the FTA Small Urban and Rural Public Transportation Grant (Section 5311) formula for the funding allocation for the County has been determined to be \$124,719.00, with a state contribution of \$62,360.00, and a County in-kind match of \$62,360.00, for a total program amount of \$249,439.00; and

WHEREAS, the County's Department of Health and Human Services reviewed all data supplied or to be supplied in the application and in its attachments, and certifies to the Board of Commissioners of the County of Gloucester that all data contained in the application and in its attachments is true and correct and that it has submitted the grant application to the County Treasurer's Office for review, and the Treasurer has approved said application.



This communication will serve as requisite opinion of counsel to be filed with NJ TRANSIT along with the Gloucester County application for financial assistance pursuant to the provision of Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act, as amended for administration, capital and operating assistance projects. The legal authority for County of Gloucester's ability to carry out administration, capital and/or operating assistance projects directly, by lease, contract, or otherwise is set forth below:

1. County of Gloucester is authorized to provide and assist public transportation by acquisition, construction and operation of existing or additional transit facilities. This assistance may be provided directly by the Gloucester County Division of Transportation Services, under the Department of Human & Disability Services, or by agreements with other parties.
2. The authority of County of Gloucester to provide funds for the local share of the project is set forth in a Resolution passed by County Board of Commissioners, and under N.J.S.A. 40:9-C-1 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 23-5.3.
3. I have reviewed the pertinent Federal, State, and local laws, and I am of the opinion that there is no legal impediment to Gloucester County making application for Section 5311 assistance. Furthermore, as a result of my examination, I find that there is no pending or threatened litigation or other action which I am aware of, which might in any way adversely affect the proposed project in the program or the ability of County of Gloucester, to carry out such projects in the program.
